Focusing on people, place, power and policy, the Center undertakes strategies to serve and empower marginalized communities. The Center invests in three ongoing initiatives: Communities of Opportunity, Vibrant Democracy Initiative, and Neighbor to Neighbor. In addition, the Center's Impact Strategies address the complexities of community challenges with a holistic approach built on research, best practices and cross-sector partnerships. Impact Strategies are community-driven and multi-year in scope, allowing for deep investment and the largest possible impact. Your investment in this fund supports the Center's overall operations and strategic grantmaking and is leveraged with additional private and public sector investments.

Communities of Opportunity

Communities of Opportunity is a partnership with King County designed to improve health, social, racial and economic outcomes for the people of our region. Working with diverse partners and across sectors, Communities of Opportunity has significant investments in White Center, SeaTac-Tukwila and Rainier Valley, as well as strategic partnerships aimed at changing systems and policies that contribute to inequities.

Vibrant Democracy Initiative

Strengthening the voice and participation of underrepresented communities is fundamental to the creation of greater equity and opportunity for all. This effort is a partnership with King County Board of Elections to remove barriers to voting and civic engagement amongst historically marginalized communities, such as communities of color, limited English-speaking communities, people with disabilities, low-income youth, veterans and people experiencing homelessness.

Neighbor to Neighbor (N2N)

One of our longest-standing programs, N2N supports grassroots efforts that increase engagement, power and influence of community members affected by poverty and racial disparities. Serving community-based organizations in South Seattle, White Center and Kent, N2N invests in advocacy trainings, direct organizing, focus groups and other mobilization efforts that build leadership among community members.
